FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Tuesday, December 8th is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a holy day of obligation. This is also the feast day of the Cathedral of the Diocese of Portland, and of the Church in the United States, and of the Franciscan Order.

RETIRED RELIGIOUS

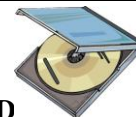
The annual special collection for the retired religious of the Church in the United States will be taken as a second collection at Masses next weekend.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The offertory collections for the last two weekends totaled \$18,400 compared to \$15,425 over the same two weekends last year. For the month of November offertory collections totaled \$42,460. This amount is \$1,755 higher than last year (*first time this fiscal year!*) and is right on target for our November budget. Outstanding!

Even with this good news, though, our offertory collections since July 1st are below where we need to be. Thus far for the fiscal year, our collections are \$5,000 less than one year ago over the same period and \$14,000 less than the amount budgeted. Please continue to be as generous as your means allow.

The second collection for the campaign for Human Development taken on the weekend of November 21st – 22nd, totaled \$1,630. The Thanksgiving morning collection to benefit the St. Joseph Fund for the Needy totaled \$640.

THE NEEDY IN OUR MIDST

The collection taken up at our parish Thanksgiving Day Mass totaled \$642.00, a wonderfully generous response. These funds have been ear-marked for our St. Joseph's Fund for the Needy, the fund available to the friars here at St. Joseph's to distribute to those who seek assistance from us. Requests for assistance come for many needs: food, fuel, rent assistance, clothing, medicine – most times from persons outside of our parish community.

We have a growing awareness, however, that these same real needs lie within our parish community. We are aware that these needs may be compounded by a recent or impending loss or cut-back of employment. We are also aware that, oftentimes, parishioners who are experiencing need are hesitant, for whatever reason, to seek assistance.

The friars here at St. Joseph's have discussed this among ourselves and with our parish council.

We wish to propose the following: parishioners who wish to assist the needy of our parish family are encouraged to purchase a gift card (in whatever dollar amount) from Shaws, Hannafords, CMP, CVS, Rite Aid, Walgreens, or other providers of vital services) and anonymously drop the gift card into the weekend collection basket. Please make sure to note the gift card's value.

Parishioners who are in need should contact one of the friars here at St. Joseph's to make their need know. All contacts will be kept strictly confidential.

The friars will, to the best of their abilities, match those in need with gift cards received.

While this is an appropriate response during this Thanksgiving/Advent/Christmas time, we hope that this outreach to the needy in our midst might continue well into the future for as long as necessary.
