Baptism is customarily celebrated on the last Sunday of the month.

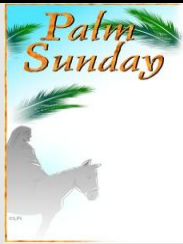
Marriage: Couples should contact the friary office at least 6 months in advance.

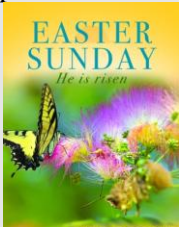

ST. BRIGID SCHOOL PARISH SUBSIDY

St. Joseph's parishioners who wish to enroll their child(ren) at St. Brigid School are eligible for a parish subsidy towards annual tuition. To apply for the subsidy, carefully read and complete the necessary agreement form for 2010-2011. The form is available at the school office. Keep in mind: Families must be registered parishioners prior to September 1, 2009, users of parish budget envelopes, and active participants in the life of St. Joseph Parish (which includes attendance at Sunday Mass). Fr. Peter will personally review each application prior to subsidy approval.

FLU PROTOCOLS AT MASS TO BE LIFTED

Bishop Malone, in consultation with the Maine Center for Disease Control and his own staff, has decided to lift the temporary H1N1 protocols at Mass effective Palm Sunday weekend (March 27th/28th, 2010). As of Palm Sunday weekend, the liturgy will be celebrated according to the usual norms that include the invitation to exchange the sign of peace and to share the Precious Blood at Holy Communion. Parishioners or those who exercise ministry during the liturgy are urged to stay home if they are ill, for their own health and that of others. However, if they do attend Mass, they should refrain from shaking hands at the sign of peace or receiving from the chalice at Holy Communion.

CHURCH SUPPORT



A total of \$7,330 was received at last weekend's four Masses. This was \$380 less than what was collected one year ago over the same weekend. As a result, we were unsuccessful in achieving our weekly "challenge goal" of a 4% increase in our offertory giving. As all of you who are weekly readers of our parish bulletin know, an anonymous parishioner has agreed to make a donation equal to 3% of that week's budgeted offertory collection from now through June 30 for each week that we exceed our "challenge goal". This week's offertory challenge goal is \$7,265.

Last weekend's second collection to benefit Catholic Relief Services totaled \$1,570. As always, your continued financial support of our parish is most appreciated. **Thank you!**

PARISH MAINTENANCE FUND
